in the drama program and held leadership positions in National Honor Society and the art club.

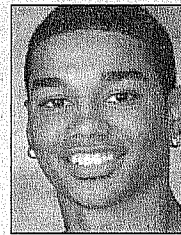
Andie Livingston participated in student body leadership class and assisted with coordinating school events. During the last two summers, Livingston volunteered her time to give back to the community.
