

## Sumner High talent shows to aid teacher

Sumner High School will present its third annual talent benefit show Friday and Saturday, with proceeds going to help a longtime driver education instructor.

Lew Linington, who's worked for the district for 29 years, is a cancer survivor and now a substitute teacher with the district.

Money raised at the shows will help Linington pay bills associated with his surgeries and treatment, said John Norlin, the Associated Student Body adviser and leadership instructor for Sumner High.

In the past two years, the talent show has raised more than \$20,000 for two other district employees battling cancer.

The talent shows will begin at 7 p.m. at the high school. Tickets are \$8 and are available at the door. This year's shows will have 32 acts featuring performers from Sumner and Bonney Lake high schools, elementary and middle schools and the community.
